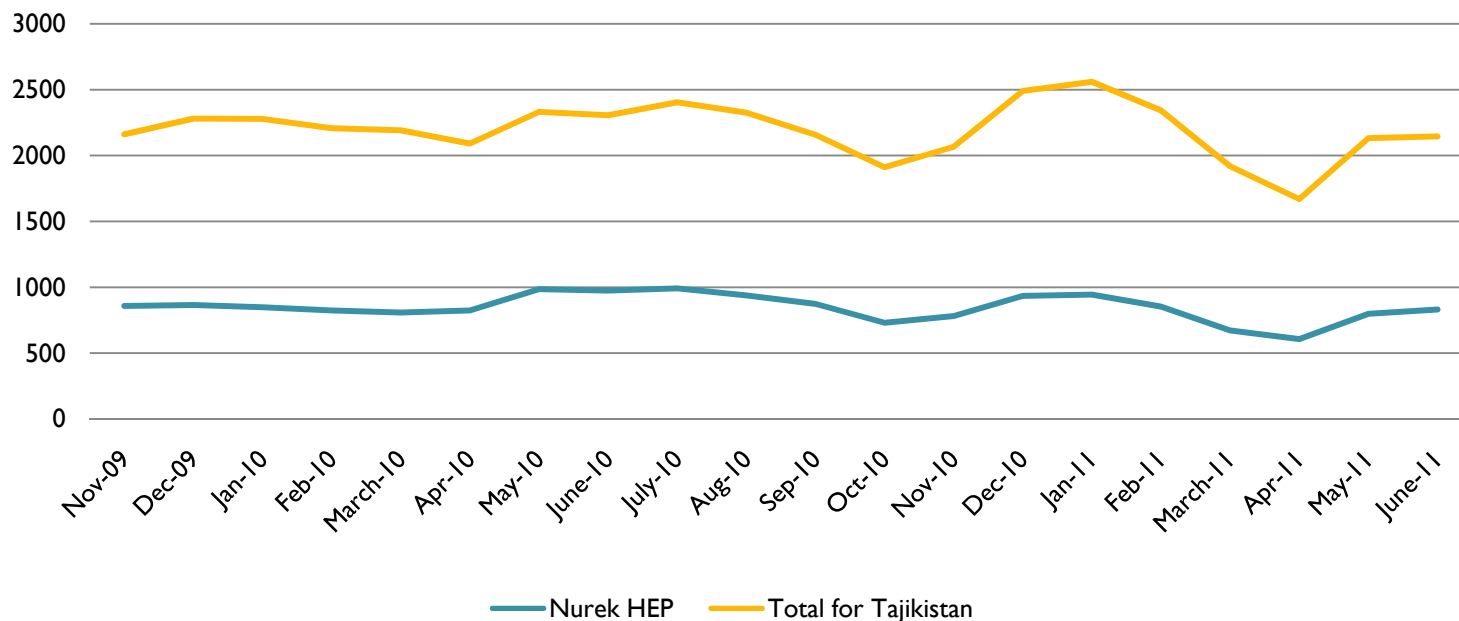

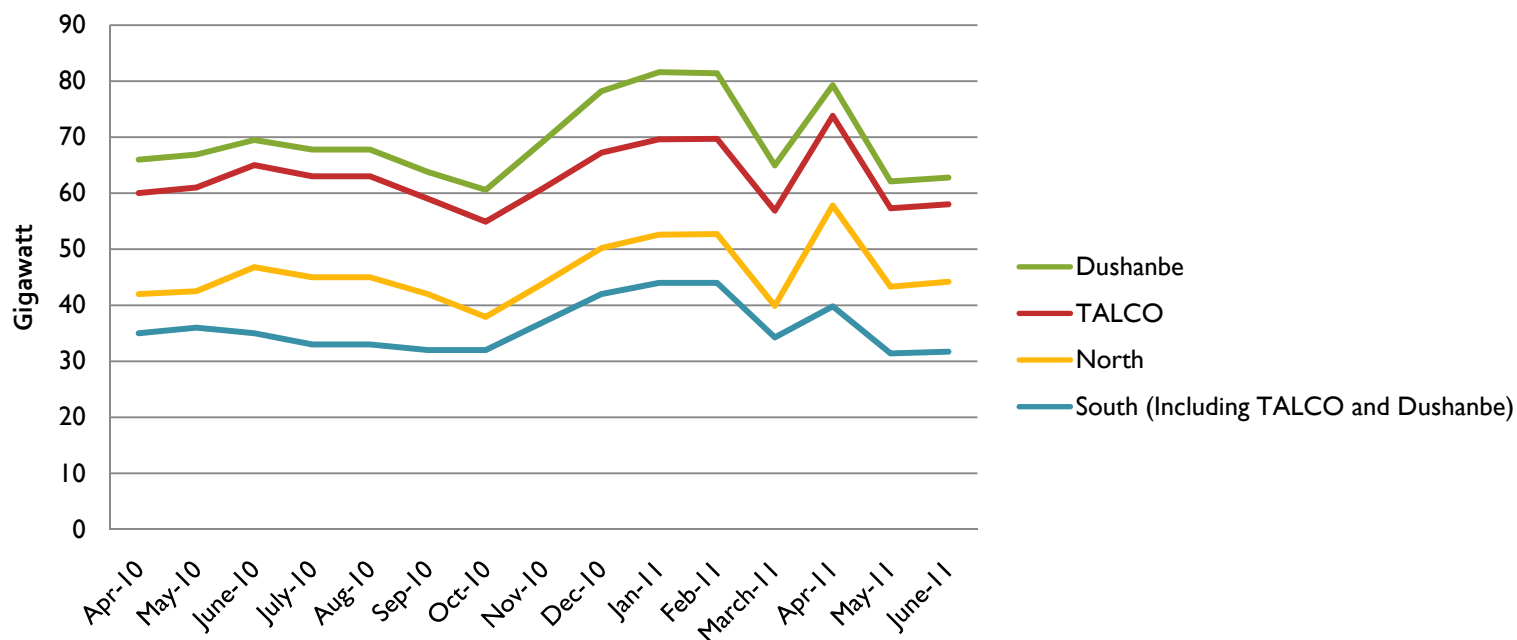
Average Electricity Production in Tajikistan (November 2009 - June 2011)

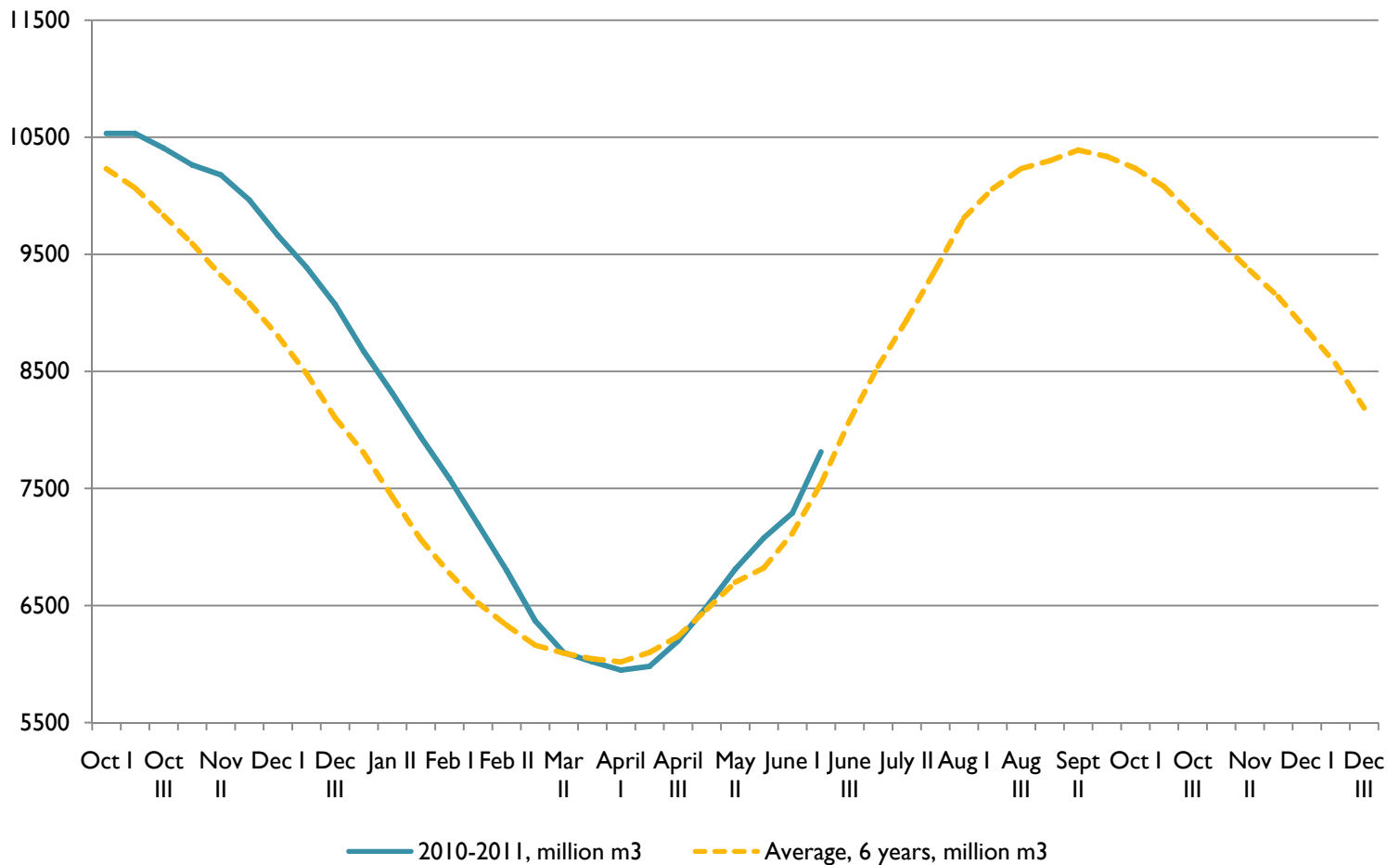
Average Daily Electricity Consumption - Tajikistan (April 2010 - June 2011) Not including GBAO (Gigawatts)



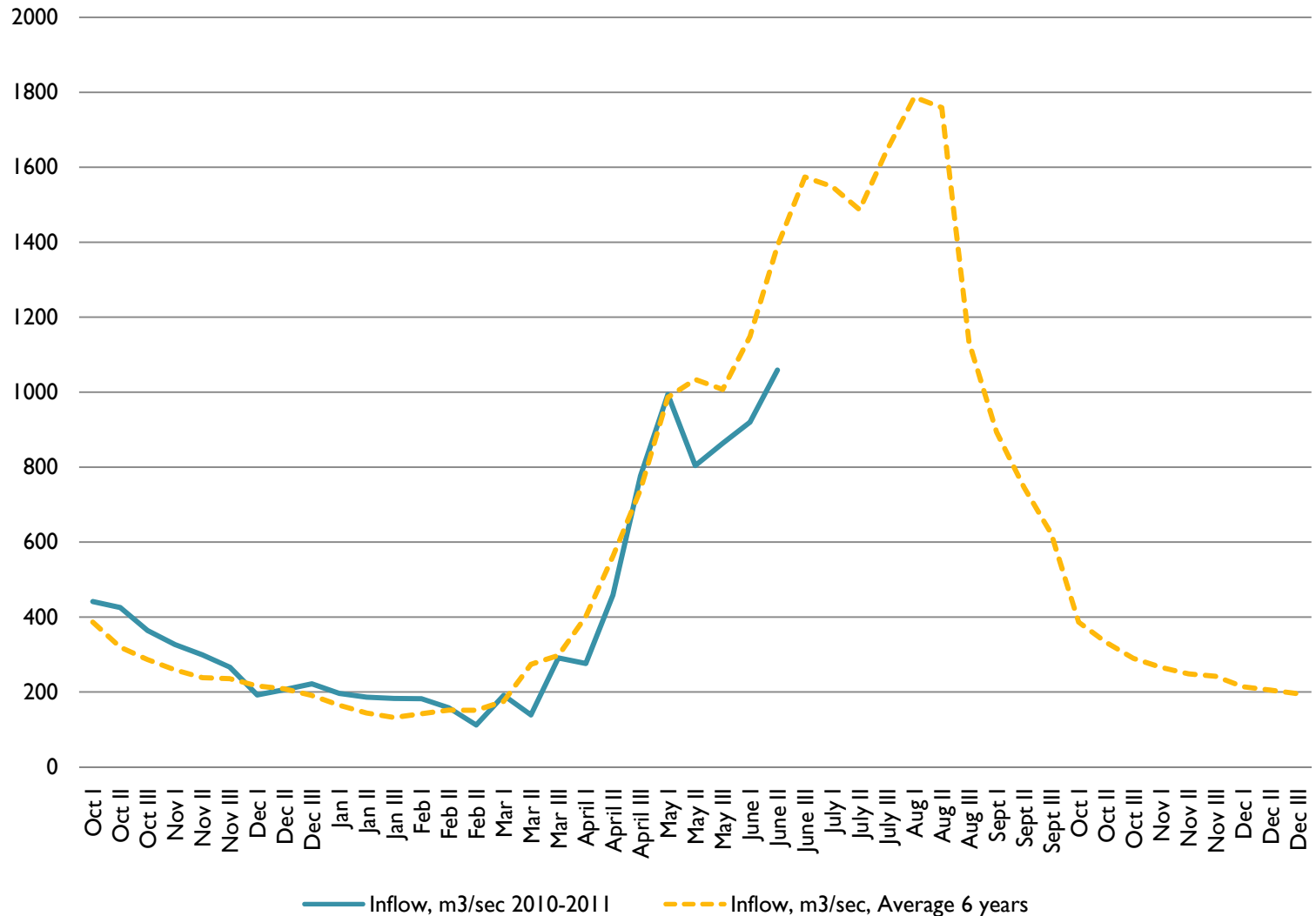
Water Volume in Nurek HEP reservoir (mln.m3)

Water level – 879.27 m (dead level 857 m)

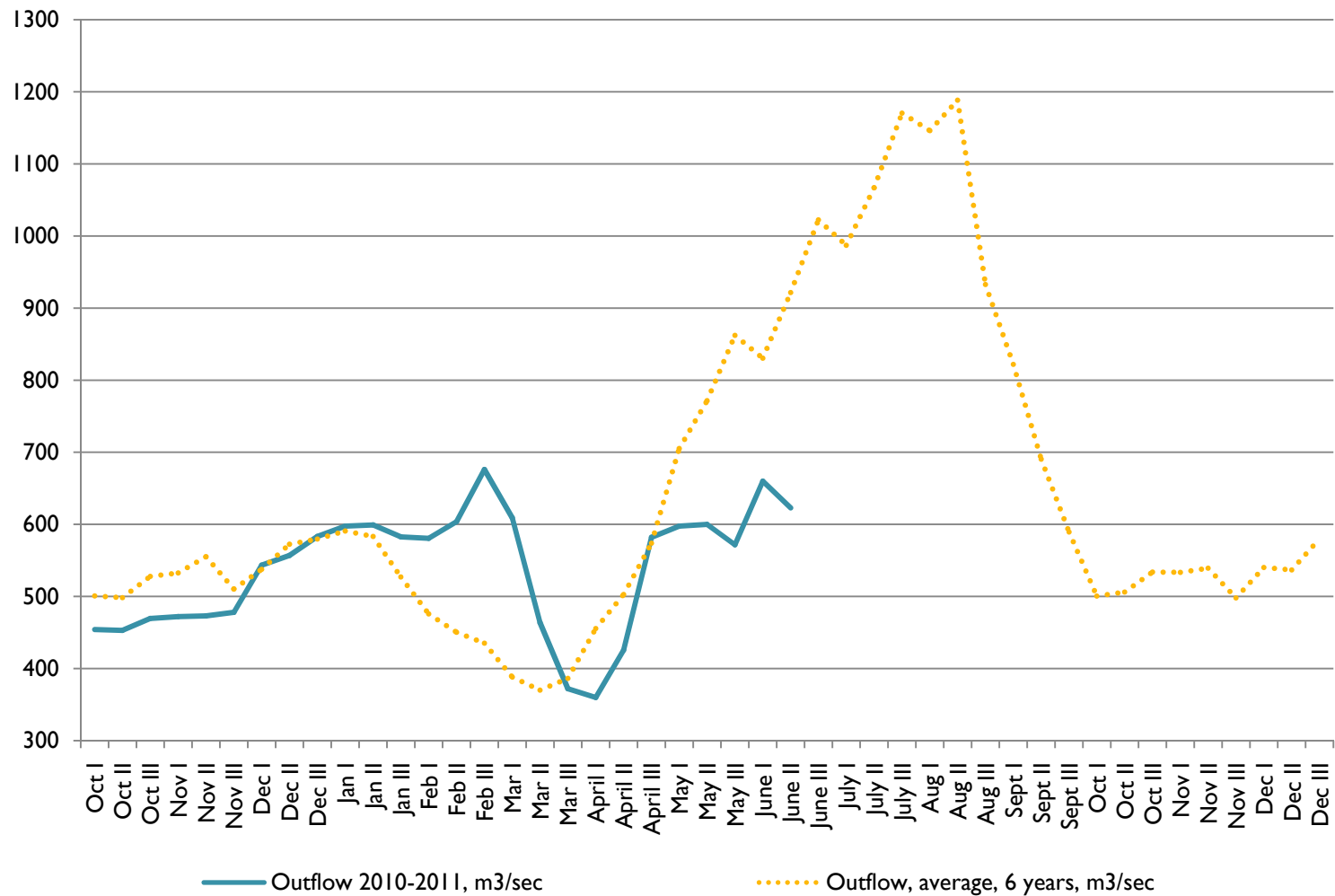
Water Volume – 7,812 mln.m3



Water Inflow in Nurek HEP reservoir (m³/sec)



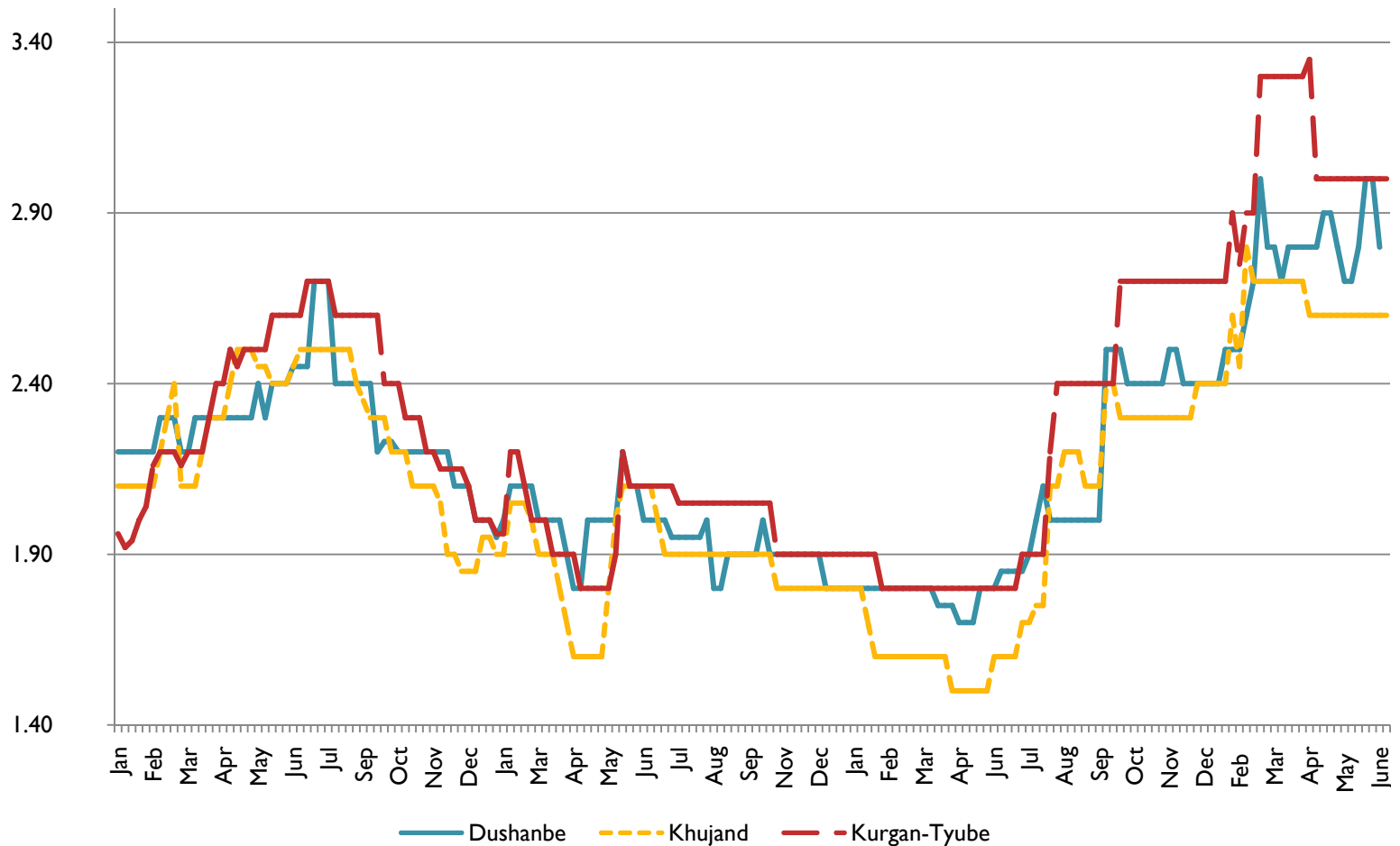
Water Outflow in Nurek HEP reservoir (m³/sec)



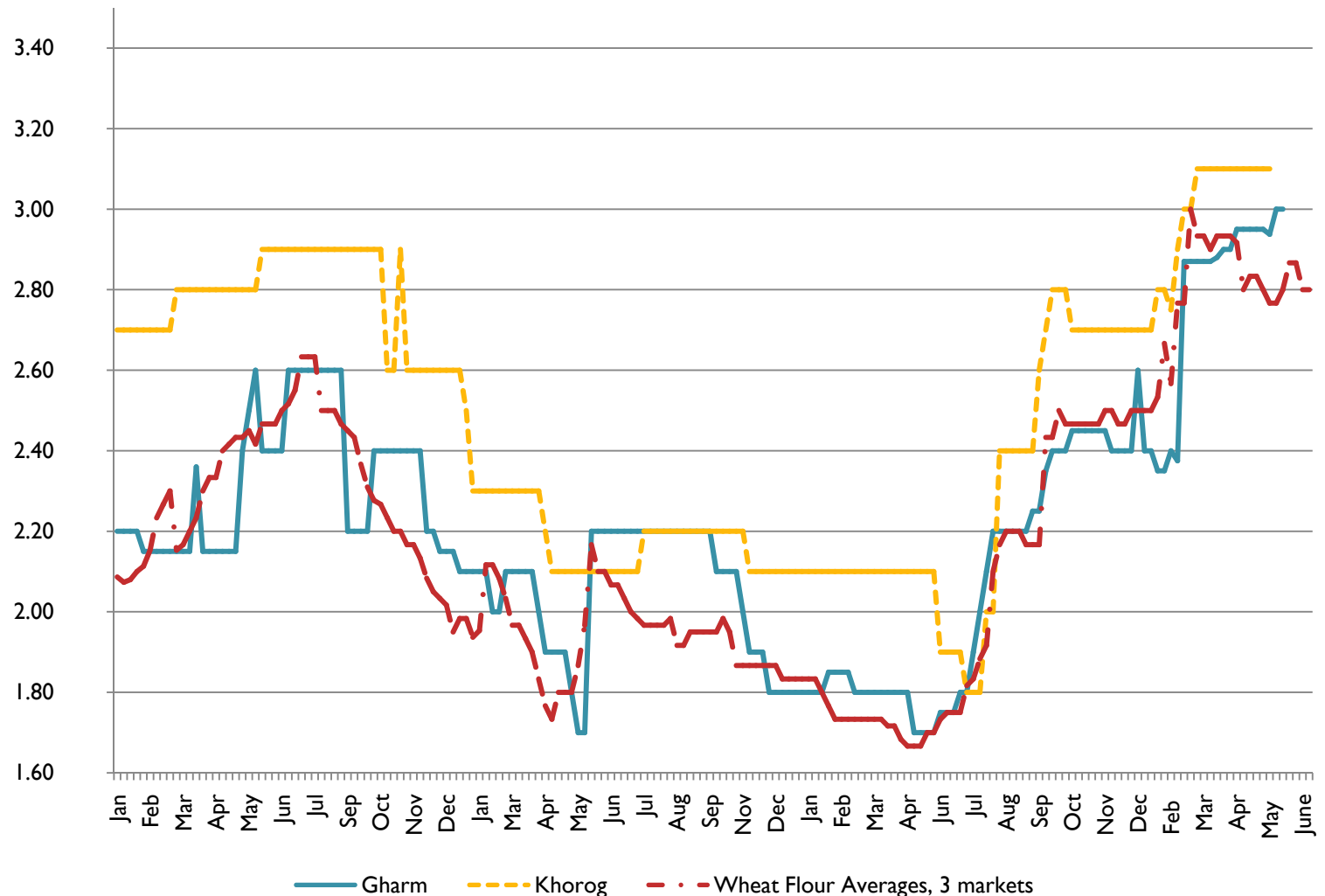

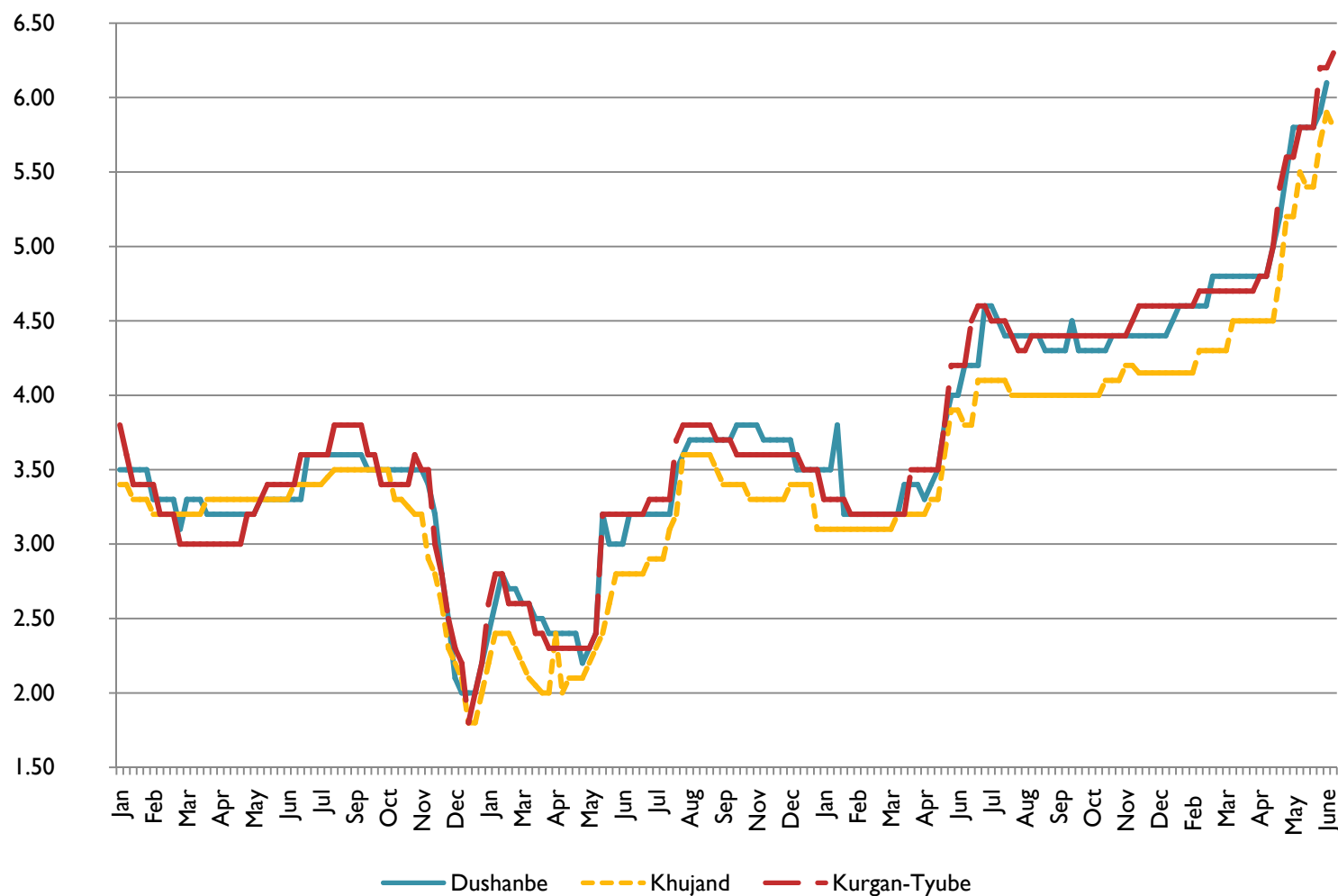
Wheat Flour 1st grade in Dushanbe, Kurgan-Tube, and Khujand markets (Jan 2008 – June 2011)



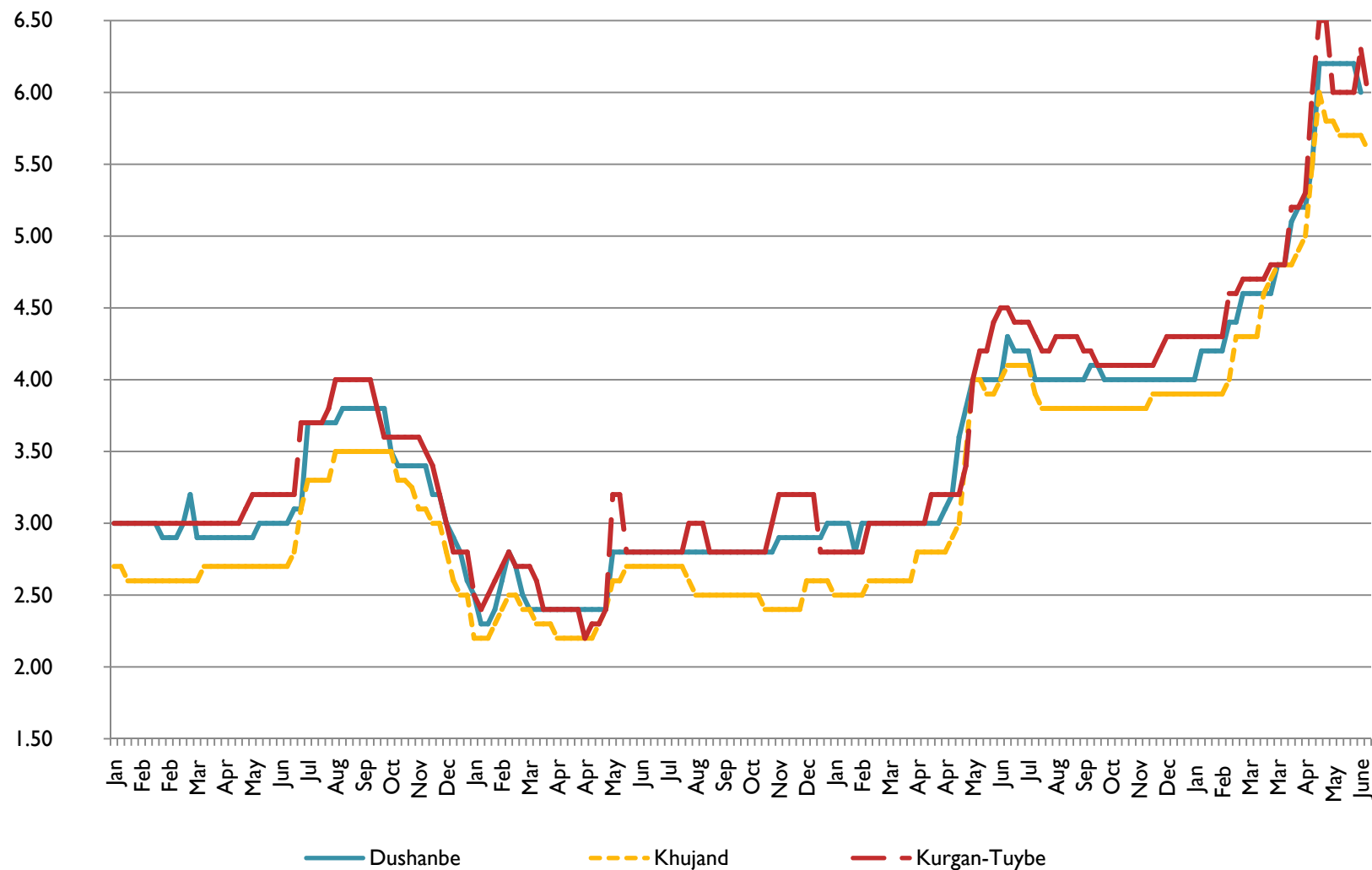

UN WFP reports....

Tajikistan Market Price Report – June 2011

- Prices for staples remained stable and still as record high level since food price monitoring period in 2002;
- Gasoline price increased by 16% (1.25 USD), and 51% higher than in May 2010 (0.86 USD);
- Prices of imported food commodities are expected to increase further due to rising gasoline prices (1.8% as of June 1, 2011);
- Rise in gasoline and food prices is expected to increase demand in foreign exchange, which leads to local currency depreciation;
