Visit Objectives

To improve skills on climate change networking and lobby among identified civil society partners in Tajikistan

Outcomes:

- Tajikistan civil society organizations are aware of CC adaptation and advocacy experiences of Nepal civil society
- The linkage between two country civil society networks are established and built upon

Climate Action Network South-East Asia - CANSA

- CANSA is a representative office of Climate Action Network (CAN <http://www.climatenetwork.org>) for South East Asia
- Civil society of Nepal have direct access to negotiations under UNFCCC process and might raise their voices directly through CAN
- Representative of CANSA attending at all UNFCCC meetings and promoting the interests of Nepal civil society and providing them with necessary climate policy information as well as responsible for their capacity building through involvement the civil society into climate debates

Climate Change Network Nepal- CCNN

- CCNN has a rotation and voluntary mechanism of leading the network.
- CCNN leads by (Clean energy Nepal - <http://www.cen.org.np/>) through the CCNN secretariat
- CCNN mostly consists of INGOs, UN bodies, local CSO
- CCNN facilitates the process of informing, empowering and influencing the Nepalese people and government to take effective actions towards addressing climate change and its impacts.

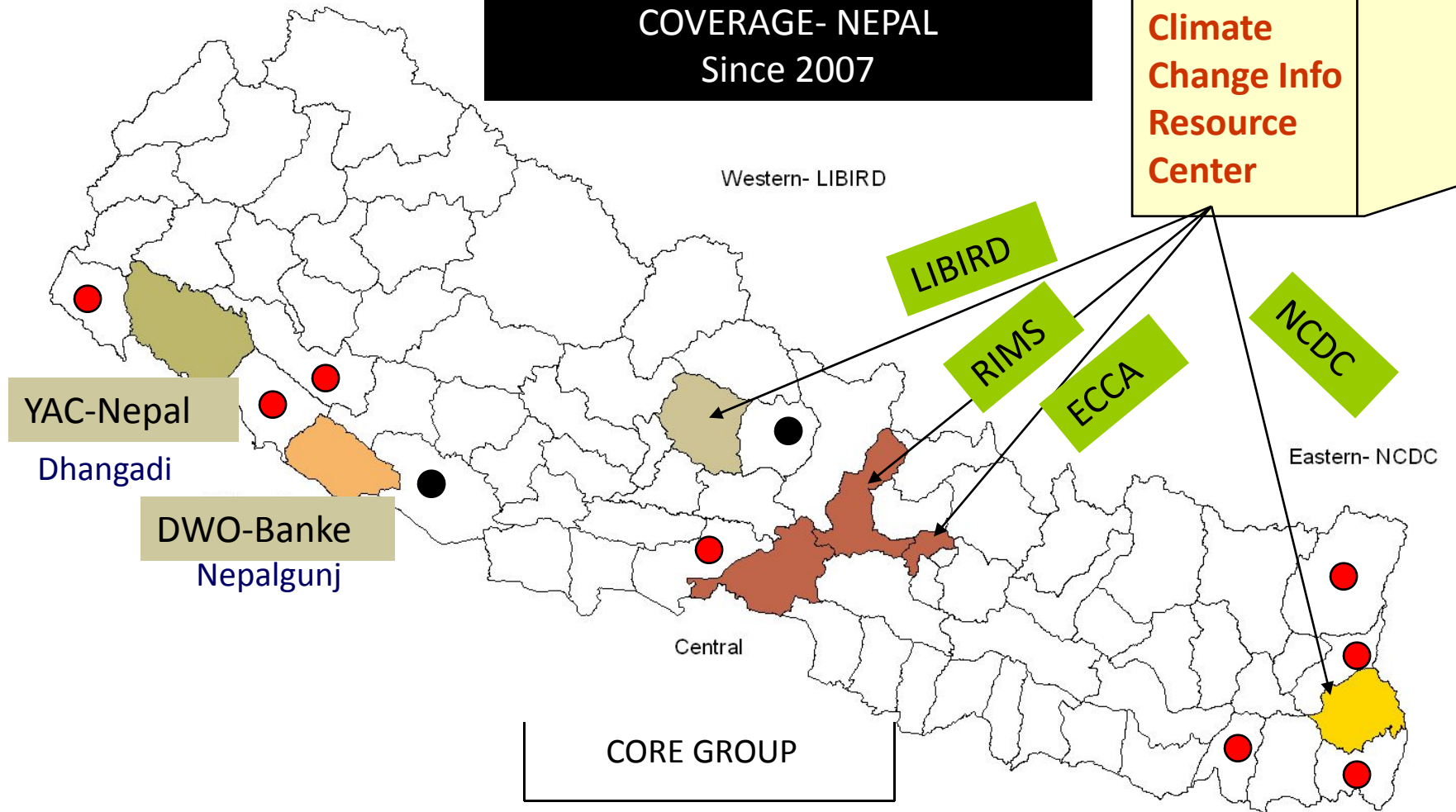
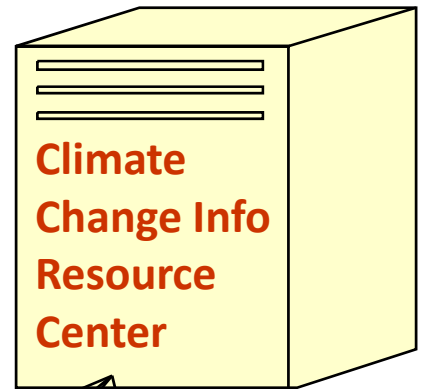


NGO Group on Climate Change in Nepal – NGCCN

NGO GROUP ON CLIMATE CHANGE COVERAGE- NEPAL Since 2007

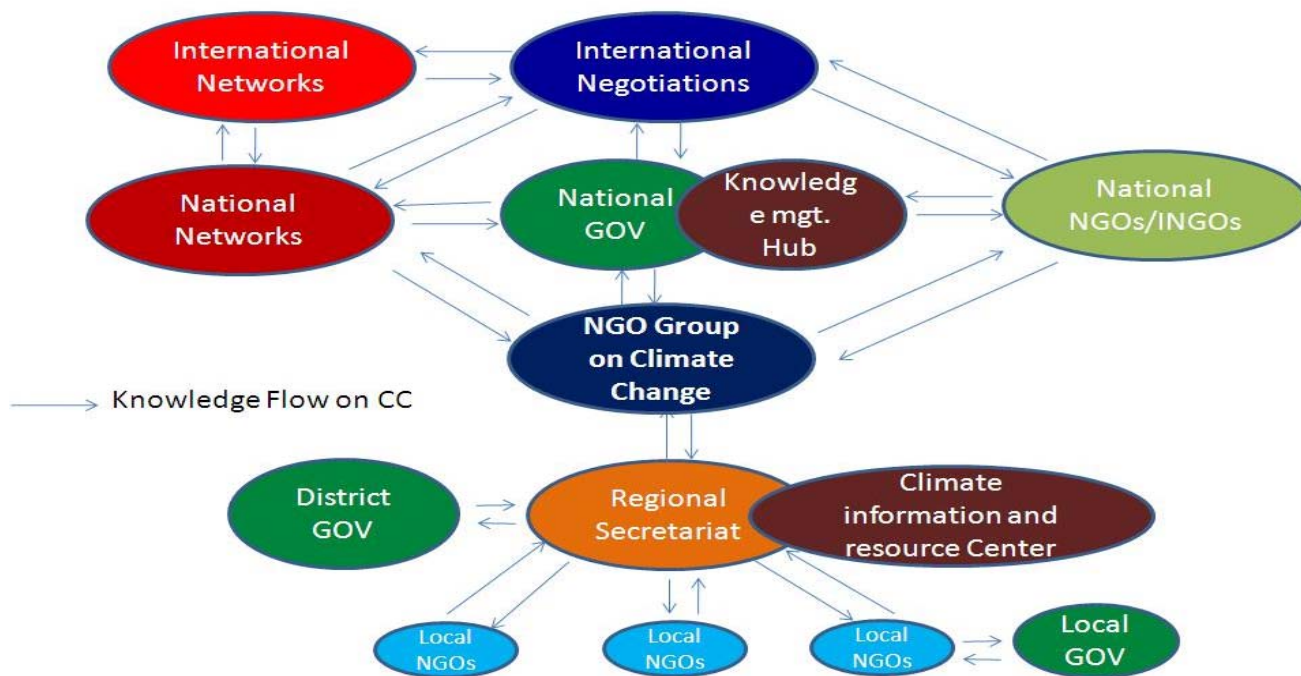

Nepalese Youth for Climate Action – NYCC

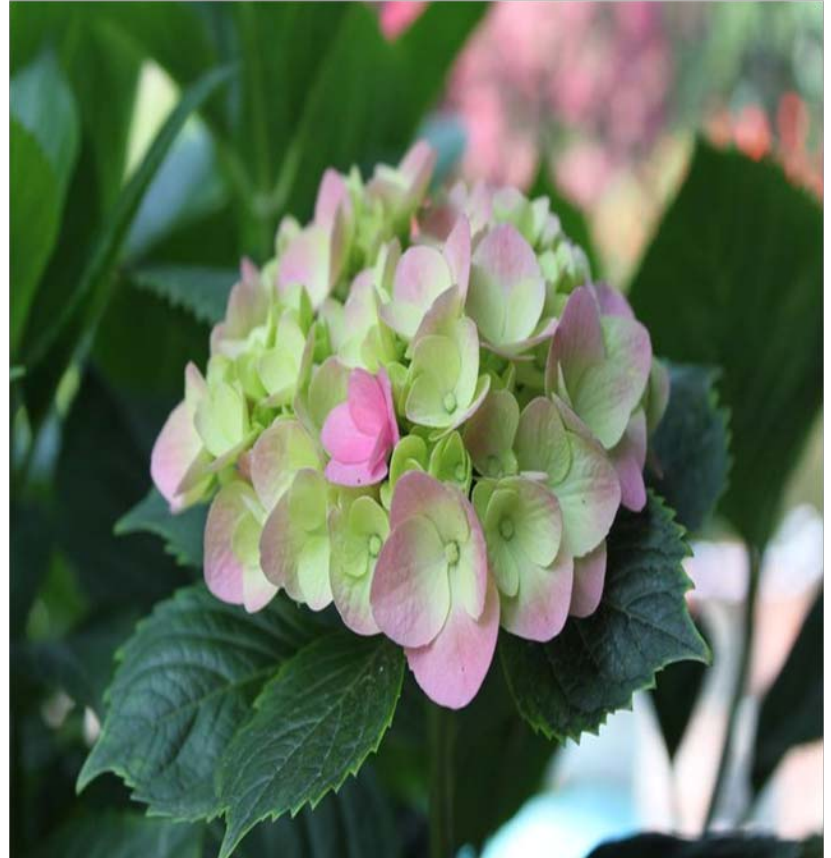
