# <u>#2 Situation Disaster Assessment Report in Asht district,</u> Sughd region Tajikistan (14 June 2011)

**Affected area:** villages Bobodarhon and Saro, Jamoat Pongaz, Asht district of Sughd region

## A. Event Overview

As a result of heavy rains, on June 11, 2011 mudflow occurred in the villages Bobodarhon and Saro, Jamoat Pongaz, Asht district, Sughd region. Following CoES and Sughd authorities request, REACT- Khujand assessment team visited disaster site on 12 -13 June and jointly with local authorities conducted primary Damage and Needs assessment.

According to the assessment, 150 families (800 people) were identified as effected population. Mudflow damaged 35 houses (of which 23 totally destroyed).





Mudflow damaged 11 km of local roads and 80 meters irrigation channels in these villages. Also 500 meters electricity supply lines were damaged and currently electricity supply lines are restored and electricity is available in the villages. Mudflow destroyed crops on 12,4 ha of kitchen gardens (potatoes, fruit trees and e.g.).

## C. Needs

According to the assessment, 800 people / 150 families need urgent assistance for food and basic non food items, like mattresses, blankets and e.g. also water cans and hygienic kits if planned to be provided.

It is worth to highlight that the most kitchen gardens of Bobodarhon and Saro villages were identified as affected and their population barely meet basic needs. These families should be provided with food assistance.





It is important to underline, that the mud flow channel is full at the moment and cleaning up activities (mitigation work) should be done with involving local population, authorities and technical support (fuel, car oil, diesel around 10 tons) as soon as possible.

500 meters of irrigation system should be restored as soon as possible, as people in the village have lack access to the pure water.

### D. Assistance provided

So far, response from Sughd region Authorities (Khukumat) provided:

- 500 somoni for each 35 effected families
- 50 kg flour, 5 kg oil, 5 sugar, for each 35 effected families
- Mattresses, kitchen kits, electric kettle, kitchen stoves and e.g. for each 35 effected families
- 3 tons fuel for cleaning up the roads

## E. Assistance to be provided:

#### Red Crescent Society of Tajikistan, Sughd region:

 For 33 affected families is planned to provide through DREF (Disaster Risk Emergency Fund) tents, mattresses, blankets, pillows, bed sheets, hygienic kits, kitchen kits, water cans (20 litters), summer tents, shovels, buckets, Flash-lights and Soaps

#### UN WFP: (for 3 month food items)

- For 150 effected families food items (flour, oil, salt,)

#### ACTED:

- Mitigation activities for 3000 euro

#### Mercy Corps:

- 40 water cans (20 litters)
