

## **Situational Report # 3**

### **Flooding in East Khatlon Region**

#### **I. Latest Overview**

The water levels decreased in the affected areas of Voce and Muminobod Districts. The population in the affected started to dig out mud from their houses and gardens, trying to salvage some of their belongings.

Affected populations shows signs of distraught and despair. Neighboring Jamoats still support the affected with food. Feeding points that serve bread and rice are established in the villages. Roads inside the villages are hardly accessible by 4WD.

Water access is very poor in many areas as pipes broke and washed away during the flood and channels filled with mud.

Many households lost a considerable amount of storage areas, where fodder for their animals was stored. Households that relied on growing saplings for the livelihood support and income generation experienced significant losses as vast cultivation areas were under mud, which in some cases reached almost a meter high.

Field mission headed by the Deputy Prime Minister Mr. Murodali Alimardonov with participation of other national and regional officials, UN agencies and INGOs visited the affected areas of Voce and Muminabad districts.

- Works on riverbank protection is underway in Michurin Jamoat of Voce district funded by local government. This was planned activity that restarted after the floods
- Affected population of Voce and Muminobad districts are still receiving food collected as donations from the neighboring community.
- CoEs and local authorities continue to assess damage in the areas, as they become accessible.
- Tomorrow morning Oxfam GB will distribute nutritional items, purification tablets and soap to children provided by Unicef in Voce and Muminabad.
- REACT Kulyab Situational Assessment is planned for Shurabad district in the village of Dashti Jum tomorrow, leaving Kulyab at 11 a.m

#### **IV. Needs**

##### **Shelter:**

- Instruments for cleaning out debris and mud are required
- Construction materials for roof restoration
- Tents for those whose houses are completely destroyed

##### **WASH:**

- Assessment on water sanitation system
- Immediate needs for water purification

##### **Food Security:**

- Assessment on food security and impact on livelihoods
- Immediate needs for supporting feeding areas
