

Earthquake in Vanj District, GBAO Tajikistan

Situation report Nº 3 07 January 2010

Situation overview

Tremors continue to create more panic amongst the population in Vanj district. Due to this, affected population refuse to spend nights in their houses. According to information provided by team of seismologists currently located in Vanj, in average around 1 – 2 tremors, with intensity of 1 to 3 happen every day. The most tangible tremor in recent days occurred on January 6, 2010 with intensity of 3-4, close to the same epicenter of the earthquake which hit the district on 2nd of January. The tremor caused another rock-fall and blocked 3 km of road on 481st km of Dushanbe-Khorog road. The roads are being cleaned everyday by road services, however the risk of rock fall is still high and the stretch of the road between Jamoat Vanj and Jamoat Yazgulom is hazardous.



Damage and needs assessment is still on-going. The

number of the fully destroyed houses remains the same: ~140 houses with 980 residents, while the number of partially damaged houses has increased to 958 homes with 6706 residents (vs previously reported 921 houses).

Today, January 7, 2010 most of the relief items released by different REACT partners have reached Vanj district. It is expected that distribution of the items, including tents will start tomorrow, January 8, 2010. It was proposed to establish a tent-camp for relocation of the families left without shelter, however population refused and requested to install tents in the yards of their houses.

Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Republic of Tajikistan is calling a meeting on January 8 where the Government is expected to give an update on current situation and present outstanding needs of the affected population.

Due to continuous tremors and population is in fear and therefore in need of psycho-social support.

Appeal

of Committee of Emergency Situations and Civil Defense under the Government of Tajikistan to REACT partners

Committee of Emergency Situations and Civil Defense under the Government of Tajikistan expresses its gratitude for all the support and assistance provided to reduce suffering of the population affected by natural disasters.

As You all know, as a result of an earthquake that occurred on January 2, 2010 in Vanj district, over 100 houses were destroyed and 900 houses were partially damaged. Over 600 people are left without shelter. Damage of different extent was caused to administrative buildings, social, cultural and health facilities, as well as to educational institutions. Over 3 km of roads have been destroyed and over 2 km of electricity supply lines.

It is worthwhile to mention that during the period from September 2007 to March 2009, over 170 tangible tremors have been recorded in this region. Continuous tremors in this region are related to activation of Vanj-Akbaltay fault. Affected population is currently in fear of recurrent tremors and in need of physiological assistance.

Current situation requires immediate relocation of over 100 households to safer areas.

Government of the country is undertaking all possible measures to provide assistance to affected population, supporting rehabilitation of destroyed buildings and facilities. New land spots have been identified for allocation to affected population for construction of new houses.

Situation is complicated due to limited access to some of the disaster affected areas. Significant shortage is faced with construction materials, fuel, food, medicines and heaters.

Considering the above, CoES is appealing to You with request to mobilize existing resources for provision of urgent assistance, such as construction materials, as well as assistance in construction of standard seismic resistant houses for affected population.
